BOUTIQUE CAMBODIA

If you want to stay in a private villa that reflects traditional Cambodian style choose Phum Baitang, a five-star 'green village' that quietly opened near Siem Reap in September. Forty-five suites are dotted among lemongrass plantations and guests can participate in cookery lessons and yoga classes, and enjoy two restaurants and a cocktail bar during their stay. Siem Reap itself is the gateway to the UNESCO World Heritage site of Angkor, the base for the Khmer kingdom between the 9th and 15th centuries and home to intricate stone temples. Cosy rooms with outdoor hot tubs and scenic views are supplemented by a spa with openair pool and fine dining restaurant The Grill that serves caviar de riofrio – the world's only organic variety – as part of its menu.

The Valentine's in the Mountains package includes two nights' accommodation, a romantic dinner for two, breakfast and a one-hour massage treatment, and is available in the first two weeks of this month.
